10:30 Visit to Rijeka City Museum

The City Museum of Rijeka acts as a live memory place of the surroundings in which it is located. The Museum is an inspiring, professional and esteemed flywheel of activities significant in the process of recognition, study, conservation and promotion of cultural and historical heritage of Rijeka. 12:30 Visit to Trsat Castle

The hill-fortress-castle of Trsat is a recreation area, historical monument and pilgrimage site all at once. Perched high on a hill overlooking all of Rijeka, this 13th-century hill-fortress enjoys a strategically crucial position. There has been a look-out tower at Trsat from the pre-historical epoch. Trsat Castle whose site has been used since Roman times to be an easy place from which to control access to the sea along the Rječina River, is situated on the steep hill overlooking the Rječina Gorge on its left bank, just above the city of Rijeka.
